#### **Departure Meeting Location**

<u>East:</u> From the stop light on Hwy 95 South & E. Kuehn St. (south side of hwy 95 overpass) go east on E. Kuehn St. for .9 miles to the intersection of E. Kuehn St. & Riggles Ave. (Riggles Ave. is I-10 Exit 19 crossover south end) Line up on the north east corner on E. Kuehn St.

North: Hwy 95 North (Central Blvd.) go I.5 mi. to Tyson Road, then East 1/4 mi. Park on the north side of the road facing west.

South: Hwy 95 South and Kuehn St., (south side of hwy 95 overpass) go south 1 mile to Mile Post 103. Park on the right (west) side of the road.

<u>West:</u> From the stop light at Hwy. 95 & Kuehn St. (south side of I-10), go 2.1 miles to just east of the Super 8 Motel and park on the north side of the road. From the Love's Station it is .6 miles. (Exit 17 on I-10)

#### Happenings though out the Season!!!!!!

**SAW SHOP** - Mon, Tue, Wed, Fri 9-11:30 and 1-3:30. Closed On Thursday for Orientation. \$1.00, \$2.00 or \$5.00 per rock set up fee. 25¢ per square inch for slabs cut.

<u>Rock Trips</u> – Every Tuesday. See monthly schedule for rock species to be collected and the meeting place. Arrive by 8:30. Caravan LEAVES promptly at 9am. No sign-up, just show up. Bring your tools, rock hammers, buckets, screw drivers AND plenty of water, snack/lunch. Bring a chair and enjoy your lunch while meeting other club member rock-a-holics. <u>Pancake Breakfast</u> – 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of the month (except in January when POW WOW may fall on 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday; then breakfast will be held 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday). Pancakes, sausage, eggs, juice and coffee. Bring your own place setting.

<u>Parades- Christmas Light Parade (December) & Hi Jolly Parade (January)</u> - Held in December during the evening, around 7 pm., and January during the morning around 10 am. The rock club puts a float in the parade. Look for the committee to sign up and help with a Theme, building and Participating.

<u>January or February Hobo Stew</u> - This is how hobo stew works. YOU bring a canned good to put in the pot (<u>NO MSG</u>, <u>NUTS</u>, <u>OR FISH</u>). The Club provides the meat for the stew. Held at the Club under the Cool Cover. Bring chair(s) and your place setting, drink and your Ticket. Can be held in November, December, January, February, and/or March, just depending on the scheduling of the club and Pit Master. It is \$5 for a Ticket.

<u>POW WOW</u> - The Club is closed during Pow Wow, Pow Wow is our BIGGEST fund-raiser. We ask members to donate prizes (value \$25 or more). Prizes are given away every 15 minutes for all 5 days at our booth. Prizes can be handmade items or purchased. Sign up to VOLUNTEER at our booth, no experience necessary. <u>Scholarship Spaghetti Dinner & Silent Auction</u> – The club raises money to be able to help the Graduating Kids of Quartzsite go to College or a Tech School, with a \$500 or more scholarship. We ask members to donate prizes (value \$25 or more) for the Silent Auction. The Auction is going on during the Spaghetti Dinner. The dinner is open to the Public. The event is held at the QIA Building, & Purchase the tickets at the Door.

<u>March – Celia's Garden Cleanup and Cookout</u> - The Club has a section of Celia's Garden that we clean up each season. YOU bring gloves & grab-its, shovel, hoe, hula hoe, and whatever you have that will help with clean up. The Club provides the vests and bags. The Club provides hamburgers, hot dogs and fixins.
